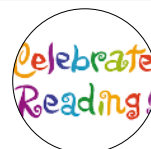
Authors Reading Advice

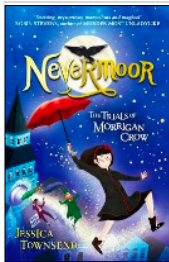
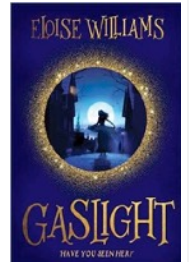
Hello everyone! I do hope you are well? Spring is here and with it some time to read outdoors in the sun, so I'm very happy.
